Does China Export solar panels?

China has at least 80% of the global market share in solar manufacturing capacity, making Chinese exports an important dataset for tracking the clean energy transition. In the first half of 2023, exports of solar panels from China grew by 34%, with 114 GW shipped worldwide, compared to 85 GW in the same period last year.

How many solar panels does China Export in 2023?

Solar modules, which are fully assembled solar panels, accounted for 90% (\$23.8 bn) of China's total solar exports by value in the first half of 2023. Over the last 12 months, China exported 111 GW of solar modules to Europe, the same amount as the total installed PV capacity of the United States.

Does China have a solar energy industry?

BEIJING - China unleashed the full might of its solar energy industry in 2023. It installed more solar panels than the United States has in its history. It cut the wholesale price of panels it sells by nearly half. And its exports of fully assembled solar panels climbed 38 per cent, while its exports of key components almost doubled.

How many solar modules are sold from China to Europe?

The number of modules sold from China to Europe also increased 47% year-on-year, culminating in 66GW of new Chinese modules being added to the European solar sector in the first half of the year alone.

How will China's Solar Exports affect Clean Power?

China currently produces around eight out of every ten solar panels, and the growth in Chinese exports has global implications for the scale-up of clean power. The data reveals that Europe accounted for 52.5% of the value of China's solar exports in the first half of 2023.

Which countries import the most Chinese solar equipment in 2023?

Brazil ranked second behind Europe in importing the most Chinese solar equipment in the first six months of 2023, while Africa had the largest relative growth, nearly tripling its procurement of Chinese solar year-over-year; this trend was largely driven by a rooftop solar surge in South Africa.

China has long been the solar module supermarket to the world, and its dominance will only increase in the coming years. Europe, in particular, has become China's best customer, buying nearly 60 percent of all solar modules exported from China in the first six months of 2023, according to clean-energy think tank Ember.
