How long do electric car battery warranties last?

Electric car battery warranties often have the longest coverage of all the warranty types available. Most manufacturers offer warranties that last eight years or 100,000 miles, whichever comes first.

Do electric car batteries have a warranty?

Beginning with the 2027 model year, the EPA will require the high-voltage battery systems in EVs and PHEVs to carry an eight-year/80,000-mile warranty. California has laws for electric car battery warranty coverage that provide even more protection than the rules set by the federal government.

Are electric car battery warranties transferable?

Yes, electric car battery warranties in the UK are usually transferable to a new owner, as the warranty tends to be attached to the vehicle itself rather than the individual who purchased it.

When does EV battery warranty start?

Hybrid and EV battery warranties last at least eight years or 100,000 miles, which is longer than most manufacturer powertrain warranties. According to some studies, total battery failure is uncommon, but electric car batteries degrade and lose 5-10% of their life in the first five years.
