

New national standard for lithium battery negative electrode materials

Can two-dimensional negative electrode materials be used in lithium-ion batteries?

CC-BY 4.0 . The pursuit of new and better battery materials has given rise to numerous studies of the possibilities to use two-dimensional negative electrode materials, such as MXenes, in lithium-ion batteries.

What are the limitations of a negative electrode?

The limitations in potential for the electroactive material of the negative electrode are less important than in the past thanks to the advent of 5 V electrode materials for the cathode in lithium-cell batteries. However, to maintain cell voltage, a deep study of new electrolyte-solvent combinations is required.

Can electrode materials be used for next-generation batteries?

Ultimately, the development of electrode materials is a system engineering, depending on not only material properties but also the operating conditions and the compatibility with other battery components, including electrolytes, binders, and conductive additives. The breakthroughs of electrode materials are on the way for next-generation batteries.

Are metal negative electrodes reversible in lithium ion batteries?

Metal negative electrodes that alloy with lithium have high theoretical charge storage capacity and are ideal candidates for developing high-energy rechargeable batteries. However, such electrode materials show limited reversibility in Li-ion batteries with standard non-aqueous liquid electrolyte solutions.

Is lithium a good negative electrode material for rechargeable batteries?

Lithium (Li) metal is widely recognized as a highly promising negative electrode material for next-generation high-energy-density rechargeable batteries due to its exceptional specific capacity (3860 mAh g⁻¹), low electrochemical potential (-3.04 V vs. standard hydrogen electrode), and low density (0.534 g cm⁻³).

Can nibs be used as negative electrodes?

In the case of both LIBs and NIBs, there is still room for enhancing the energy density and rate performance of these batteries. So, the research of new materials is crucial. In order to achieve this in LIBs, high theoretical specific capacity materials, such as Si or P can be suitable candidates for negative electrodes.

Current research appears to focus on negative electrodes for high-energy systems that will be discussed in this review with a particular focus on C, Si, and P.
